Joshua 1: ⁵ No man shall *be able to* stand before you all the days of your life; as I was with Moses, *so* I will be with you. Keep the right perspective- know the Word of God!

Health, finances, sustenance, relationships, safety, death, etc.

There is no peace for the wicked! Isaiah 48:22

"These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

> We must understand the consequences of fear—crippling

Loss of sleep, loss of peace, loss of happiness, loss of health, loss of relationships.

Why does God allow us to see iniquity and trouble, in our self or in others?

Why God allows us to see iniquity in our self.

- To keep us humble
- To make us submissive in the hour of trouble
- To make us value salvation all the more

Why God allows us to see iniquity in others.

- To show us what we might have been ourselves
- To make us see the wickedness of sin, that we might pass by it and hate it, and not indulge in it ourselves
- To make us admire the grace of God when He saves sinners
- To set us more earnestly to work that God can use us to save others and extend God's kingdom

DEEP FAITH

Habakkuk 2:4

I will stand my watch And set myself on the rampart, And watch to see what He will say to me, And what I will answer when I am corrected. ² Then the LORD answered me and said: "Write the vision And make *it* plain on tablets, That he may run who reads it. ³ For the vision *is* yet for an appointed time; But at the end it will speak, and it will not lie. Though it tarries, wait for it; Because it will surely come, It will not tarry. ⁴ "Behold the proud, His soul is not upright in him; But the just shall live by his faith.

> We must believe

Habakkuk was first troubled that there was no judgment against Judah; God answered by telling him judgment was on the way. Now Habakkuk is troubled by the agent of judgment, the Babylonians - who were an even more wicked people than the people of Judah.

"Before those words broke upon my mind I hated God and was angry with him because, not content with frightening us sinners by the law and by the miseries of life, he still further increased our torture by the gospel. But when, by the Spirit of God, I understood those words - 'The just shall live by faith!' 'The just shall live by

faith!' - then I felt born again like a new man; I entered through the open doors into the very Paradise of God." (Luther, cited in Boice)

In Hebrew, the important part of the verse has only three words: "the justified man," "by his faith," and "will live." Every word in Habakkuk 2:4 is important, and the Lord quotes it three times in the New Testament just to bring out the fullness of the meaning

- Romans 1:17 is the commentary on the justified man "The just shall live by faith"
- Hebrews 10:38 is the commentary on faith "The just shall live by faith"
- Galatians 3:11 is the commentary on the Christian life "The just shall live by faith"

> We must be runners of faith

Habakkuk first had to see the vision. You cannot make anyone else see what he does not see for himself.

Habakkuk then had to make it known. You must do what you can to make the word of God known, and make it known in as many ways as possible.

Habakkuk had to make it known as permanently as possible - he was told to write the vision. You must do what you can to make a permanent impact on your listeners.

Habakkuk had to make it plain. "I have sometimes thought that certain ministers fancied that it was their duty to make the message elaborate, to go to the very bottom of the subject, and stir up all the mud they could find there, till you could not possibly see them, nor could they see their own way at all ... They tell people all the difficulties they have discovered in the Bible, - which difficulties most of their hearers would never have heard of unless their ministers had told them." (Spurgeon)

Habakkuk had to make it practical- that he may run who reads it. It doesn't say, "that he who runs may read it," but "that he may run who reads it."

The running - the activity and progress - comes forth from God's word.

> We must constantly remind others

DELIBERATE FRUITFULNESS

Habakkuk 3

When I heard, my body trembled; My lips quivered at *the* voice; Rottenness entered my bones; And I trembled in myself, That I might rest in the day of trouble. When he comes up to the people, He will invade them with his troops. ¹⁷ Though the fig tree may not blossom, Nor fruit be on the vines; Though the labor of the olive may fail, And the fields yield no food; Though the flock may be cut off from the fold, And there be no herd in the stalls—¹⁸ Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation. ¹⁹ The LORD God is my strength; He will make my feet like deer's *feet*, And He will make me walk on my high hills. To the Chief Musician. With my stringed instruments.

> We must stay fixated on the relationship
